- through gullies
- approaching corners
- on crests; and
- in areas with roadside vegetation.



# Protecting Our Local Wildlife

South-East Queensland contains significant natural areas of high conservation value which provide home to a rich diversity of native wildlife species.

In Wildlife Conservation areas we share our roads with wallabies, koalas, bandicoots, echidnas, owls, ducks, snakes, lizards and possums.

One of the major impacts on our wildlife is roads. Fauna continues to move according to their daily habits for feeding and breeding.

## PLEASE DRIVE CONSIDERATELY



With animals in road reserves, be prepared for the unexpected. Animals will behave in different ways. Some animals may 'freeze' when 'lit-up' by your headlights whereas other animals may move erratically across the road



*Wallabies are most active from dusk to dawn. Please be especially aware during this time of day!*
